Updates from the Township of Ocean Library

(2) Medicare Counseling -- Have a question or problem involving Medicare? Then, you will want to register for one-on-one assistance with the State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP). SHIP provides confidential, unbiased information and assistance for evaluating health insurance options and dealing with claims. They can also help in applying for financial assistance for prescription plans, Medicare Parts A and B deductibles, premiums, co-insurance, and co-payments for qualifying beneficiaries. SHIP volunteers will be at our branch on August 1, 2023 and August 15, 2023 from 1:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. Please note: An appointment is required. You can register for an appointment by calling 732-728-1331.



(4) StayNJ Senior Tax Relief Program -- StayNJ Program is a newly introduced permanent State of New Jersey senior tax relief program designed to provide New Jersey seniors with a 50% property tax reduction. All senior homeowners earning less that \$500,000 annually are eligible to receive up to \$6,500 in direct property tax relief every year, beginning January 2026. StayNJ also expands access to and increases the benefits of both the Senior Freeze and ANCHOR programs. Seniors will be able to apply for all three programs at the same time through a single common application form that will be available beginning in the Fall of 2025. (5) Please Note -- There is a new traffic pattern in place for Deal Road westbound at Route 35. 

(5) Consider Joining The Monmouth County Library's Book Discussions This Month** --

August 2, 2023 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join this book club to discuss "The Glass Castle" by Jeannette Walls. This memoir tells the remarkable story of the Walls children who learned to take care of themselves. They fed, clothed and protected one another and eventually settled in New York. Their parents followed them, choosing to be homeless even as their children prospered. (Please note this book club discussion will be hybrid -- presented in person at the Library Headquarters in Manalapan and on Zoom.)

August 17, 2023 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join this book club to discuss "There is Nothing for You Here: Finding Opportunity in the 21st Century" by Fiona Hill. As the last of the local mines closed, Fiona Hill's father urged her to get out of their blighted area in northern England. Ms. Hill did journey -- much further than her father could have dreamed. This coal-miner's daughter studied in Moscow and at Harvard, became an American citizen, and served three American presidents. By the time she testified at the first impeachment inquiry into former President Trump, Ms. Hill knew that the desperation of forgotten people was driving American politics over the brink. In this very powerful and personal book, Ms. Hill shares what she has learned, and why she believes that only by expanding opportunity can we hope to protect democracy. (Please note this book club discussion will be hybrid -presented in person at the Library Headquarters in Manalapan and on Zoom.)


