#### **Important News**

- (1) All branches of the Monmouth County Library will be closed on September 6, 2021 in observance of Labor Day.
- (2) September is Library Card Sign-up Month -- A library card is your gateway to great works of literature, exciting movies and a host of digital resources like eBooks. If you need a card, please visit our library. Our library staff will be glad to assist you. (Remember to bring along your driver's license.) And, if you have family, friends or neighbors who don't yet have a library card -- be sure to encourage them to get a card so they can experience all that our library has to offer.
- (3) New Member Outreach (Free Books Too!) -- While we are not yet able to host our usual large book sales, we have been busy reaching out to our community. Two such outreach events took place last month. On August 2, 2021 volunteers from the Friends of the Township of Ocean library staffed a table outside of our township library offering a selection of free books culled from the donations we received prior to the pandemic. We also handed out membership forms to residents interested in joining our ranks. The very next evening we shared a table with the Ocean Township Library staff at our town's National Night Out event. Both of these events proved to be an excellent way to sign up new members and increase awareness about the Friends organization and the many services provided by our library.



#### **Updates from the Township of Ocean Library**

(1) The Results Are In! -- Monmouth County Library's Summer Reading Program concluded on August 15, 2021. And, the Ocean branch's adult readers have once again earned the distinction of having the most adults completing the challenge. Of those who logged, there were 563 books read -- far surpassing all the other branches (the branch holding second place had 298 books read). Great job Township of Ocean library branch readers!

#### **Book Club Discussions:**

**September 8, 2021 at 10:30 a.m.** -- Join this virtual book club to discuss **"People We Meet On Vacation" by Emily Henry.** In this novel, Poppy and Alex, who have nothing in common, become the best of friends after a ride home from college. Every summer

since they have taken a one week vacation together -- that is until two years ago when they ruined everything. They haven't spoken since. Poppy now has a week to fix everything. What could possibly go wrong?

**September 22, 2021 at 10:30 a.m.** -- This virtual book club will discuss **"Friends and Strangers" by J. Courtney Sullivan.** In this novel, Elizabeth, an accomplished journalist and new mother, is struggling to adjust to small town life. Elizabeth hires Sam to babysit. Sam, a student at a local women's college also is struggling -- between following her life plan or a romance that threatens her ambition. But, when Sam finds a kindred spirit in Sam's father-in-law the stark differences between the two women are revealed and a betrayal has devastating consequences.

September 22, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. -- Join "Welcome, Autumn Poetry: The Weather Is Worth Endless Praise: a virtual open mic session with poets Flora Higgins and Evelyn Hampton (who is also a long-time member of the Friends of the Township of Ocean Library). Ms. Higgins and Ms.Hampton, published poets and members of the Jersey Shore Poets, will be reading from their poetry collections, followed by an open mic session for all who wish to read a poem of their choosing. (If you intend to share a poem, please provide the poem's title as you register.)

### **Short Story Discussion:**

**September 23, 2021 at 10:30 a.m.** -- This short story discussion will focus on **"The Handsomest Drowned Man In The World" by Gabriel Garcia Marquez.** When the body of a handsome stranger is found afloat in a small remote town by the ocean, the townsfolk attempt to discover his identity.

#### Read the Book and Meet the Author:

September 30, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. -- This author talk will feature Julian Sanction's "Madhouse At The End Of The Earth: The Belgica's Journey Into The Dark Antarctic Night." Mr. Sanction, a senior features editor for Departures Magazine, tells the story of the 1897 journey of the good ship Belgica on a three-year expedition to Antarctica. Drawing on diaries and journals from the crew and with exclusive access to the ship's logbook, Sanction brings to life the story of human extremes -- one so extreme that NASA studies it for research on isolation for future missions to Mars.

- (1) We Will Never Forget -- September 11, 2001 was a day that changed the world forever. In commemoration of the 20th anniversary of the attacks of September 11, 2001, the Monmouth County Library and the 9/11 Memorial & Museum are presenting an in-person poster exhibit. Told across a series of 14 posters, this exhibition includes archival photographs and images of artifacts from the Museum's permanent collection. A Reminder:

Help Our Community -- Want to do your part to help our community? Here are simple ways you can make a difference.

- (1) Mask Up in Risky Indoor Settings -- Due to the increasing number of COVID-19 cases and hospitalizations, as well as new data suggesting the Delta variant is more transmissible, New Jersey is now strongly recommending that both vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals wear masks in indoor settings when:
  - . The space is crowded
- . There is the potential for close contact with others who may not be fully vaccinated
  - . The vaccine status of other individuals is unknown
- . When individuals who are immunocompromised or at increased risk for severe disease are present.
- (2) Don't Forget to Access Your COVID-19 Vaccination Record On Your Phone With -Docket -- this new app, from the New Jersey Department of Health, makes it easier for you and your family to securely access your COVID-19 vaccination history. Individuals with an email or phone number on file with the New Jersey Immunization Information System can access and download their COVID-19 vaccination record using this app. If you don't have your vaccination card with you or if you've lost it, you'll be able to easily access your record through the app to provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination as needed. Future plans call for the Docket App to expand access to provide full immunization histories. The Docket app is now available (in English or Spanish) in the App store or on Google Play. Please note that the app adheres to federal and state standards for data security and privacy.
- (3) Eviction Protections -- As our state winds down the COVID-19 eviction moratorium, Governor Murphy signed legislation that provides critical protections to renters who experienced economic hardships during the pandemic.
