Updates from the Township of Ocean Library

(1) Color Our World Through Books -- If you are ready to enrich your life through a journey full of art, creativity, and imagination, then be sure to visit our library to pick up some great books to read this summer because -- The Monmouth County Library system is once again sponsoring its Summer Reading Challenge! This year the program kicks off June 1, 2025 and runs through August 15, 2025. The theme this year is "Color Our World." According to the Monmouth County Library, this year's program "is designed to inspire and engage readers of all ages through a diverse array of artistic expressions".

As in the past, each registered participant will be reading towards an opportunity to win a prize. So sign up and start logging your books right away to ensure your prize eligibility.

If you participated in the summer reading challenge in the past, you can use the same username and password to register this year. No problem if you've forgotten your username or password, you can simply reset it. If you experience any difficulties, stop by our library and one of our amazing library staff members will assist you.

The summer reading program levels are: "Read To Me;" "Vacation Reading Club" (Grades K - 6); "Teens" (Grades 6 - 12); and "Adults" (Age 18+).

Let's make Ocean the top library branch in the number of books/ebook/audiobooks read this year. Be sure to log in ALL the books you read between June 1, 2025 and August 15, 2025. The more books you read, the better. So, READY...SET...READ!

(2) Movies...Movies....Movies -- Interested in enjoying a good movie? Then look no further than our library, where a number of terrific movies are being shown this month. And, best of all, the movies are all free to attend! Movies are shown each and every Thursday of the month at 2:00 p.m.

(3) Book Club --The Ocean Township Library Book Club will meet on June 5, 2025 at 10:30 a.m. to discuss "The Man in the High Castle" by Phillip K. Dick. This book depicts an alternative history in which the United States has lost World War II and been divided between Germany and Japan. Fifteen years later, several characters realize something is not quite right with their world as they discover a book describing what would happen if the U.S. had won the war. (An Amazon Prime series was created based on the book.) The discussion will be moderated by librarian Adam Rule. Copies of the book are available for pick up at our library's circulation desk. Please note: No registration is required to participate.

(4) In-person Short Story Discussion -- A short story discussion, moderated by Branch Manager Mary Patterson, will be held on June 12, 2025 at 10:30 a.m. The story is "A Temporary Matter" by Jhumpa Lahiri. This story is about love, loss, and the quiet unraveling of a marriage. What happens when silence says more than words? Registration is required.

(5) Imagination to Innovation -- An innovative new program, Writing & Animating Stories with AI, is coming to our branch on June 4, 2025 from 6:30 p.m. - 7:15 p.m. At this hands-on workshop you'll learn how to use OPENAI to create and animate an engaging children's story. In just 45 minutes, you'll explore how to generate imaginative story ideas and bring your characters to life with AI-generated illustrations. Please bring your laptop so you can follow along and create your own AI-powered story. Registration is required.

If you prefer to take advantage of in-person early primary voting, you can do so from June 3, 2025 - June 8, 2025. The early primary voting polls will be open from 10:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m. weekdays and on Saturday and from 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. on Sunday. Grab a Book and Sit Awhile

Looking for a good book to read this month? No problem! This month we once again are spotlighting several different ways you can locate recommended books in just about every genre.

(1) A Friend's Pick -- As you know, we occasionally feature books recommended by one or more of our members. This month one of our members is recommending "The Book of Lost Names" by New York Times and USA Today Bestselling Author Kristin Harmel.

Inspired by an astonishing true story from World War II, this book tells the story of a young woman in France with a talent for forgery who helps hundreds of Jewish children flee from the Nazis. In doing so, she also makes a vow to ensure that the real names of the children -- many too young to remember who they really are -- are preserved.

According to the Friend's member who shared this recommendation, "this engaging and fascinating historical novel held my attention from the very first page. I couldn't put it down. The author captures the resilience of the human spirit in the face of unimaginable evil and the ability of individuals to marshal the courage and strength necessary to overcome."

This book earned a 4.5 (out of 5) rating from BookBrowse, a 4.4 rating from Goodreads, and a 4.7 rating on Amazon.

(2) Our Collective History -- If you enjoy books about American history then be sure to check out our newsletter's latest feature. This month we'll once again explore our country's collective history by recommending a topic or individual worth exploring through books.

For this month's topic, we suggest exploring the Underground Railroad and its most famous "conductor" Harriet Tubman. The railroad was an organized network of secret routes and safe houses used by freedom seekers to escape to the abolitionist northern United States and eastern Canada (although other routes were established to the Indian territories, the Caribbean and Mexico). It began in the 1780s and grew steadily until the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863. The railroad was a decentralized network of free Blacks, white abolitionists, former slaves, Native Americans and others opposed to slavery. Among the figures who played a prominent role in the railroad were William Still, sometimes called the Father of the Underground Railroad, Thomas Downing, a free Black man in New York whose Oyster restaurant was a stop on the railroad, Mary Meachum, a free Black woman living in St. Louis, and Harriet Tubman, who made some 13 missions to rescue enslaved people and who served as a scout and spy for the Union Army during the Civil War.

There are several excellent books available to learn more -- "Harriet Tubman: The Road to Freedom" by Catherine Clinton, "Harriet: The Moses of Her People" by Sarah Hopkins Bradford, "The Underground Railroad: Authentic Narratives and First Hand Accounts" by

William Still, and "Hidden in Plain View: A Secret Story of Quilts and the Underground Railroad" by Jacqueline L. Tobin.

And, if you want to make your journey into history a family affair, there are even books on Harriet Tubman and the Underground Railroad suitable for the young people in your life including "Who Was Harriet Tubman" by Yona Zeldis McDonough (geared for ages 7 - 9), "Harriet Tubman Book for Curious Kids: Exploring the Inspiring Life of a Courageous Freedom Fighter" by Timothy Starlyn (geared for ages 8 - 12), "If You Traveled the Underground Railroad" by Ebony Wilkins" (geared for ages 7 - 10), and "Patchwork Path: A Quilt Map to Freedom" by Bettye Stroud (geared for ages 5 - 8).

And, if you'd like to learn more about our state's role in this topic, check out the New Jersey State Library's June 19, 2025 virtual author talk "Abolition and the Underground Railroad in New Jersey". See item two under the More to the Story Section below for more details on how you can participate.

We hope you'll enjoy learning more about this difficult chapter in American history and the brave Americans who fought for the liberty of others.

(3) Something New -- Spring and summer are seasons of rebirth when everything feels so new -- from the giant trees in Joe Palaia Park to the flowers in your garden. It's also the perfect time to explore something new...in your reading! And, thanks to Goodreads your search for something really new is as easy as can be. That's because Goodreads has compiled a list of new authors releasing a debut novel between now and September. The list, which features 42 titles, includes contemporary novels, mysteries, romance, fantasy, historical fiction and even horror offerings. You can begin exploring the list at:

- (4) Father's Day Fun -- If you would like a fun book to enjoy with the children in your life to mark this month's Father's Day celebration -- then pick up a copy of the new children's book "Papa Doesn't Do Anything" by Tonight Show host and New York Times best selling author Jimmy Fallon. Through imaginative rhymes and illustrations, Fallon shows that Papas are ALWAYS doing something and that there's nothing they won't do for you. This book is currently the number one release in children's humor on Amazon.
- (5) A Glimpse Behind The Classics -- If you've enjoyed the works of Mark Twain and want to learn more about the man who penned such classics as "The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn", "A Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court" and "The Adventures of Tom Sawyer" then you'll want to check out the new sweeping biography "Mark Twain" by Ron Chernow. Chernow, the Pulitzer Prize-winning author of "Grant" and "Alexander Hamilton", not only chronicles Twain's life, but also offers a deep dive into an author who became such a fixture in American literature despite his shortcomings.
- (6) Living After Loss -- If you are a fan of Kelsey Grammer, then you know he has brought laughter into millions of homes through TV series like Cheers and Fraser. What many fans don't know is the inner pain he struggled with on daily basis because of a tragedy that occurred when he was just 20 years old -- that's when Grammer's beloved

younger sister, Karen, was kidnapped, raped and brutally murdered. If you want to learn more about his private struggle, check out Grammer's newly released book "Karen" in which he recounts the memories of his sister, the grief and devastation caused by her death, and his long struggle to healing. This book is already a New York Times best seller and one of Oprah's most anticipated books of 2025.

- (7) Like Mysteries -- but don't like very violent story lines? Then you'll want to check out the genre's more cozier offerings -- a brighter alternative to gritty thrillers. And, you're in luck because this branch of mysteries is becoming increasingly popular. What makes a cozy mystery...well cozy? Sure there's a murder, but there is also usually a small-town setting, an amateur detective, humor, romance, warmth, and lots of unusual (but likeable) characters. If you are interested in cozying up to a good mystery then visit BookBub and browse their list of "16 Charming New Cozy Mysteries Coming in 2025". The list includes "The Library Game" by Gigi Pandian, "Murder by Cheesecake" by Rachel Ekstrom Courage, "Silent as the Grave" by Rhys Bowen and "Killing Me Souffle" by Ellie Alexander. - (8) Consider Joining The Monmouth County Library's Book Discussion This Month**

June 18, 2025 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join a hybrid (in-person or on Zoom) Book Club discussion of "The Jane Austen Society" by Natalie Jenner. This book was selected in celebration of Jane Austen's 250th birthday. Chawton, a small English village, was the final home of Jane Austen. Just after World War II, Chawton is home to a few distant relatives of Austen and their diminishing estate. With the last bit of Austen's legacy threatened, a group of disparate individuals come together to preserve both her home and legacy.

June 18, 2025 at 2:00 p.m. -- Join this in-person Book Club discussion of "The Wager: A Tale of Shipwreck, Mutiny, and Murder" by David Green (who also authored the NY Times best-selling "Killers of the Flower Moon"). This book is a story of shipwreck, survival, and savagery -- culminating in a court martial that reveals a shocking truth.

June 26, 2025 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join a hybrid (in-person or on Zoom) Book Club discussion of "The Daughter of Time" by Josephine Tey. This detective novel concerns a police officer's investigation into the alleged crimes of King Richard III of England. While recuperating in the hospital a bored Scotland Yard Inspector investigates Richard's life and the case of the Princes in the Tower. Was the claim of Richard being a murderer a fabrication of Tudor propaganda?

Special Program Spotlight

Debbie Bagchi, former Ocean Township librarian, recently presented a program on "Thinking of Starting a Book Club? Let the Library Help!" at the Monmouth County Library Eastern Branch.

We wanted to share the wonderful tips and resource suggestions Debbie provided in case you missed the program.

Getting Started:

- What kind of club do you want? Choose your format (in-person, online, hybrid), preferred genre (mystery, historical fiction, biography, etc.), and tone (casual conversation or in-depth discussion).
- Who do you want to invite? Start with your network. A group of 6 8 works best.
- Where and when? Find a convenient location -- library, coffee shop, your home, etc.
- How will it work? Set clear expectations up front: how books will be selected, who facilitates, and how often you'll meet. Debbie strongly suggests setting up a structure and guidelines up front.

Take Advantage of Monmouth County Library's Book Club Kits:

The Monmouth County Library (MCL) offers Book Club Kits with everything your book club will need. Each kit contains 10 copies of the same title in a handy tote bag. The kit can be borrowed for 5 weeks. As of now, there are 338 kits available featuring many different genres and themes -- so you are bound to find something that sparks a great discussion.

To reserve a Book Club Kit simply:

- Visit monmouthcountylib.org
- Log in with your library card.
- Click on "Find It Here" in the top menu.
- Select "Book Your Kit".
- Browse the available list of kits (there's a summary included for each title).
- Choose your pickup library and borrowing dates.

There are FAQs to help guide you through this process and you can always ask our branch's librarians for help if you need it.

Explore Other Available Resources

- Books About Starting a Book Club -- Here are a few you might wish to consider "Read it and Eat: A Month-by-Month Guide to Scintillating Book Club Selections and Mouthwatering Menus" by Sarah Gardner, "The Reading Group Handbook: Everything You Need to Know, From Choosing Members to Leading Discussions" by Rachel W. So whether you're diving into historical fiction, contemporary novels, memoirs, or mysteries, the Monmouth County Library is your best ally for getting your book club off the ground -- and keep it thriving.
