Updates from the Township of Ocean Library

(1) Fun Facts -- During the first quarter of this year, our library branch circulated over 46,000 (!) items, hosted over 14,000 visitors, and made over 130 library cards (more cards are coming as our town's local kindergarten classes will soon be touring our library and receiving their library cards). A big thank you to our wonderful library staff whose hard work and dedication made these amazing results possible!

(2) Love a Good Movie? -- Then you'll be happy at this sneak peek of news. Our branch will resume showing movies beginning in June! The first film up will be "The Eyes of Tammy Faye," on June 16, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. The film provides an intimate look at the rise, fall and redemption of televangelist Tammy Faye Baker.
