# Important News

- (1) All branches of the Monmouth County Library will be closed July 5, 2021 in observance of Independence Day.
- (2) Calling All Friends -- It's TIME to Join The Summer Reading Program -- We ask all Friends of the Township Of Ocean Library to be sure and join the Monmouth County Library's summer reading program. And, don't forget to encourage your friends and family members to do the same. The summer reading program runs through **August 15, 2021**.

As in summers past, it is easy to participate. The first step is to register by going to: <a href="https://monmouthcountylib.beanstack.org/users/sign\_in">https://monmouthcountylib.beanstack.org/users/sign\_in</a>
If you participated in the summer reading program in the past, you can use the same user name and password to register this year. No problem if you've forgotten your user name or password, you can simply reset it.

Then, every time you read a book, simply log the book on the Beanstack website.

The summer reading program levels are: "Read To Me;" "Vacation Reading Club" (Grades K - 6 grade); "Teens" (Grades 6 - 12); and "Adults" (Age 18+). Meet your program level's goal and you earn a prize.

In 2019 Ocean was the top branch library in number of books/ebook/audiobooks read-let's do it again. Be sure to log in ALL the books you've read between June 1 and August 15, 2021. The more books you read, the better. So, start reading!

# Updates from the Township of Ocean Library

(1) Summer Schedule Starts This Month -- The Township of Ocean Library is operating on a summer schedule on Saturdays in July and August. Our branch will be open from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. on Saturdays. Normal Saturday hours resume in September.

Monday -- 10:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday -- 9:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. Friday -- 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. Saturday 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.\*\*

Curbside pick-up still will be available Monday through Thursday from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. (Curbside pick-up is unavailable on Friday and Saturday.)

- (2) Masks are no longer required in the library for vaccinated visitors. It is recommended that non-vaccinated visitors kindly wear a mask while visiting the library.
- (3) Our branch's study rooms are now open to the public with no capacity limits. While the township hasn't started hosting art exhibits yet, the Terner Gallery section is open for studying.

## Updates from Our Cultural Collaborators

(1) The Township of Ocean Historical Museum -- The Township of Ocean Historical Museum will be closed on July 4, 2021 in observance of Independence Day. The museum will be open on all other Sundays in July from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. Please Note: Masks are required for all visitors and staff.

The Museum is featuring a new exhibit "Aftermath: How World War II Changed a Nation". This new exhibit explores how the cultural, social, technological and political transformation of the U.S. between 1945 and 1960 stems directly from the conditions of war. Be sure to stop by and check out this exhibit.

As a reminder: The Township of Ocean Historical Museum's 11th American Doll Tea will be held from 1:00 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. on Sunday, August 1, 2021. (Rain date is Sunday, August 8, 2021). **Book Club Discussions:** 

July 7, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. -- Love is in the Air Part III-- Join this virtual book club to discuss "An Offer From A Gentleman" (Bridgerton Book Series 3) by Julia Quinn. In this book, Sophie Beckett sneaks into Lady Bridgerton's masquerade ball. Although the daughter of an earl, Sophie has been relegated to the role of servant by her stepmother. But, dancing with the handsome Benedict Bridgerton, she feels like royalty. Benedict has sworn to find and wed his mystery miss, but a maid catches his eye. If he offers her his heart, will Benedict sacrifice his only chance for fairy-tale love?

**July 15, 2021 at 10:30 a.m.** -- This virtual book club will discuss **"Madame Fourcade's Secret War" by Lynne Olson.** In 1941 a thirty-one-year-old Frenchwoman, born to privilege and known for her beauty, became the only woman to serve as a chef de resistance during the war. No other French spy network lasted as long or supplied as much critical intelligence. Ms. Olson tells the fascinating story of a woman who stood up for her nation, her fellow citizens, and herself.

**July 28, 2021 at 10:30 a.m.** -- This virtual book club will discuss **"The Vanishing Half" by Britt Bennett**. The Vignes twin sisters are identical, but after growing up together in a small southern black community and running away at the age of 16, everything about their lives is different. What will happen to the next generation, when their own daughters' storylines intersect? This novel considers the lasting influence of the past as it shapes a person's decisions, desires and expectations.

## **Short Story Discussion:**

**July 22, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. --** This short short discussion will focus on **"How Pearl Button Was Kidnapped" by Katherine Mansfield.** This is a story about the clash of two cultures seen through the eyes of a child.

Once you have your pass you will have free access to all of New Jersey's 51 state parks and forest facilities that normally charge daily walk-in or parking fees.
