- (1) Scam Alert -- This is from our town's police department. Several scams have been resurfacing lately to defraud people out of money. The latest scam involves a letter sent via the U.S. Postal Services that advises you that your home or other assets will be subject to a tax sale if you do not call a 1-800 number. Please DO NOT call the number listed in the mailer. Instead, call your creditors directly at the number you have for them if you have questions or concerns. If you have any doubts, you can always contact the Ocean Township Police Department at 732-531-1800 for help.
- (2) Calling All Fourth Graders -- Monmouth County officers Surrogate Maureen T. Raisch, Sheriff Shaun Golden, and County Clerk Christine Giordano Hanlon are inviting fourth-grade students in Monmouth County to showcase what they like best about Monmouth County by having them create a poster that fits the theme "My County". Artwork should depict whatever the student feels is unique and special about our county. Prizes will be awarded for First, Second and Third Place. And, there will also be nine honorable mentions.
