(7) Have a Hyundai or Kia? -- Then you'll want to pay special attention to an alert issued by New Jersey State Attorney General, Matthew J. Platkin. According to the Attorney General, a nationwide trend has started impacting New Jersey in recent months where thieves are targeting Hyundai and Kia vehicles due to a viral social media challenge that provides step-by-step instructions for thieves looking to exploit the vehicles' anti-theft vulnerabilities. The target of these thefts are Hyundai and Kia vehicles without push-button ignitions and immobilizing antitheft devices (there are some 143,000 such vehicles registered in our state). Owners of such vehicles are encouraged to contact Hyundai at 800-633-5151 or Kia at 800-333-4542 for information on the FREE technology fix.

(8) Recycling -- Ocean Township is taking a major step forward to support a cleaner environment with the launch of a one-year pilot program for single-family units, in partnership with Un-Waste, a local organics and recycling company. During this pilot program Ocean Township will include "plastic film" as an accepted item in its curbside recycling program.

Important Things To Know About the Program:

- Plastic Film includes food packaging plastic (such as bread wrappers), dry cleaning bags, food storage bags such as Ziplock_(R), plastic wraps that come around multi-packs of bottled water/paper towels/diapers.
- It DOES NOT INCLUDE chip bags, pet food bags, waxed paper containers, food-soiled paper or cardboard, diapers, polystyrene or foam containers.

PLEASE NOTE THAT YOU MUST PLACE THE PLASTIC FILM IN SPECIAL PLASTIC FILM ONLY Recycling Bins These new bins are available for FREE pick-up at the town's Recycling Center located at 3603 Sunset Avenue Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. - 2:30 p.m. and Saturday 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

Un-Waste will pick up the material ON THE LAST MONDAY OF EVERY MONTH. Simply put out your Plastic Film Only Recycling Bin curbside the night before.

(9) Street Lights -- Our town's police department is reaching out to let residents know the proper procedure for reporting street light outages in the community. Working street lights are an effective tool to prevent crime, as well as help ensure motorist, bicyclist and pedestrian safety. 


Coming in October to the Monmouth County Library System...
