killed and the kidnapped victim's wife is threatened. The Shadow, originally written by Walter Gibson, was the most popular fiction radio program of the 1930s and 1940s.

November 10, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. -- The Food/Mood Connection -- Join Rachel Tansey of Rutgers Family & Community Health Sciences as she discusses how food impacts our moods and how our mood impacts the foods we crave. You'll leave with a better understanding of this important connection.

Help Our Community -- Want to do your part to help our community? Here are simple ways you can make a difference

(1) Don't Forget To Vote -- November 8, 2022 is Election Day. Among the important choices you will make -- voting for who will be on our town's local school board. If you

need more information go to the League of Women Voters of Southern Monmouth County's website at www.lwvsmc.org

- (2) Child Tax Credit -- New Jersey households with incomes of \$80,000 or less are eligible for gross income tax credits of up to \$500 per child under the newly amended child tax credit law. The credit will be available in 2023 when you file your 2022 tax forms. To learn more go to this link
- (3) Get Boosted -- If you haven't already done so, be sure and get the new COVID-19 bivalent booster that offers stronger protections against severe illness and death from the Omicron sub-variants. You can receive this booster as long as it has been two months since your most recent booster or primary vaccination series. And, some great news the bivalent booster is now available for children. The new Pfizer bivalent booster is recommended for all individuals 5 years and older. The new Moderna bivalent booster is recommended for those ages 6 and older. Locations offering the boosters can be found at www.covid19.nj.gov
- (4) Don't Miss Out -- More than three million NJ residents are eligible for up to \$1,500 in property tax relief under the new ANCHOR program (which replaces the Homestead Rebate Program). The deadline for filing is December 30, 2022. To be eligible for this year's ANCHOR benefit, you must have occupied your primary resident on October 1, 2019 and met income limits. You must also file (or be exempt from) NJ income taxes. Payments will be sent out no later than May 2023. To find out more about the ANCHOR program, including how benefits are calculated and paid, and answers to frequently asked questions, you can visit this link.
