(1) **Summer Reading Program Launches** -- The Monmouth County Library is hosting its annual summer reading program. This year the program kicks off **June 1**, **2021 and runs through August 15**, **2021**. **The theme this year is "Tails and Tales"**.

As in the past, each registered participant will be reading towards an opportunity to win a prize. So sign up and start logging your books on June 1 to ensure your prize eligibility.

If you participated in the summer reading program in the past, you can use the same user name and password to register this year. No problem if you've forgotten your user name or password you can simply reset it.

The summer reading program levels are: **"Read To Me;" "Vacation Reading Club"** (Grades K - 6 grade); **"Teens"** (Grades 6 - 12 ); and **"Adults"** (Age 18+).

In 2019 Ocean was the top branch library in number of books/ebook/audiobooks read - let's do it again. Be sure to log in ALL the books you read between June 1 and August 15, 2021. The more books you read, the better. So ready, set, go -- start reading!

(2) Primary Election Day in New Jersey is Tuesday, June 8, 2021 This primary election will be an "in-person" voting event. The governor's office and all 120 seats in the state legislature are on the ballot.

- (2) Just A Quick Reminder -- The Township of Ocean Library has resumed it normal hours of operation. You can visit our branch:

Monday -- 10:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday -- 9:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. Friday -- 1:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. Saturday 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.\*\* \*\* During July and August our branch's Saturday hours are 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.

Curbside pick-up still will be available Monday through Thursday from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. (Curbside pick-up is unavailable on Friday and Saturday.)

- (3) Our library branch's book drop is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Please note, that all materials should only be returned in the book drop. Returned materials will no longer be quarantined for 72 hours.
- (4) Other Updates -- Computer use, which during the pandemic was by appointment only, is now available on a first come, first serve basis. Reservations will only be required if all computers are in use. Limited seating (one chair per table) is available throughout the library, but the "Quiet Room" remains closed to the public.



#### **Updates from Our Cultural Collaborators**

(1) The Township of Ocean Historical Museum -- The Township of Ocean Historical Museum will be closed on June 20, 2021 in observance of Father's Day. The museum will be open on all other Sundays in June from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. Please Note: Masks are required for all visitors and staff.

The Museum will open a new exhibit "Aftermath: How World War II Changed a Nation" on Sunday, June 27, 2021. This new exhibit will explore how the cultural, social, technological and political transformation of the U.S. between 1945 and 1960 stems directly from the conditions of war. Be sure to stop by and see this fascinating exhibit.

Please note some important updates regarding The Township of Ocean Historical Museum's 11th American Doll Tea. The event will be held from 1:00 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. on Sunday, August 1, 2021. #### **Book Club Discussions:**

June 8, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. - OR - June 9, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. -- Love is in the Air Part II -- Join this virtual book club to discuss "The Viscount Who Loved Me" (Bridgerton Book Series 2) by Julia Quinn. In this book, the gossip columnists have it wrong. London's most elusive bachelor, Anthony Bridgerton, hasn't just decided to marry -- he's even chosen his wife. The only obstacle is his intended's older sister.

**June 17, 2021 at 10:30 a.m.** -- This virtual book club will discuss **"The Searcher" by Tana French.** In this mystery book a Chicago policeman, who has retired to a bucolic Irish village, finds that even small towns shelter dangerous secrets.

#### **Author Talks:**

June 8, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. -- Join author Alex Tresniowski to discuss his book "The Rope". This gripping and powerful book tells the story of what happened in the tranquil, segregated town of Asbury Park, New Jersey, in November of 1910. A 10-year-old schoolgirl, Marie Smith, is

brutally murdered and a black handyman and ex-boxer named Tom Williams is arrested for the crime and quickly presumed guilty by the white mob, ready for a lynching. But did Williams really do it? Williams' case became only the third legal case ever handled by the a new civil rights organization, the NAACP. This book is an important piece of history that resurrects a long-forgotten true crime story that speaks to the very divisions tearing at the nation's fabric today.

June 23, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. -- Alka Joshi will join in the discussion of her book "The Henna Artist". This novel brings to life the story of 17-year-old Lakshmi who escapes from an abusive marriage to the pink city of Jaipur. There Lakshmi becomes the most highly requested henna artist -- and confidante -- to the upper class. But, she can never reveal her own secrets.

### **Short Story Discussion:**

June 24, 2021 at 10:30 a.m. -- This short short discussion will focus on "The Haunted Boy" by Carson McCullers. This story is about a young boy who becomes deeply concerned when he returns from school to find that his mother is not at home.

(2) Vaccination Help for the Homebound -- If you are unable to leave home to receive a COVID-19 vaccine or if you have a family member who is homebound, you can now receive help. Monmouth County residents can call the Monmouth County Regional Health Commission No.1 at 732-493-9520 or the Monmouth County Health Department at 732-845-2070 to request an in-home vaccination appointment for anyone who is homebound.
