Happening Around Town

If you wish to make a monetary donation to allow for the purchase of perishable items, gift cards, and turkeys, please make your check payable to the Community Hope Fund. Donations can be made Monday - Thursday, 8:30 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. and Fridays, 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

All donations should be dropped off at the Department of Human Services building at <u>601 Deal Road</u>.
