(1) Happy Birthday -- Did you know that the Monmouth County Library System turns a very vibrant 100 this September 18, 2022? Our branch will be celebrating this amazing anniversary with many fun programs and activities throughout the month of September. Stay tuned for more details!

(3) Are You Signed Up? --The Monmouth County Library's summer reading program is in full swing and it runs through

August 15, 2022. The theme this year is "Oceans of Possibilities".

As in the past, each registered participant will be reading towards an opportunity to win a prize. (The prize this year is an aluminum, BPA-free 20 oz. water bottle.) **So sign up and start logging every book you read to ensure your prize eligibility.**

If you participated in the summer reading program in the past, you can use the same user name and password to register this year. No problem if you've forgotten your user name or password, you can simply reset it.

The summer reading program levels are: "**Read To Me;**" "**Vacation Reading Club**" (Grades K - 6 grade); "**Teens**" (Grades 6 - 12); and "**Adults**" (Age 18+).

(4) Afternoon Movie -- Free movies return to our library branch on July 14, 2022 at 2:00 p.m. with the film "Dune" This film, adapted from the 1965 novel by Frank Herbert, tells the story of a noble family that becomes embroiled in a war for control of the galaxy's most valuable asset while its heir struggles with visions of a dark future. "Dune" is rated PG-13 and it won six Academy Awards (including for Best Achievement in Visual Effects, Best Sound, and Best Achievement in Cinematography).

(7) Consider Joining The Monmouth County Library's Virtual Book Discussion This Month** --

July 14, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join this virtual book club to discuss "Lady in the Lake" by Laura Lippman. This mystery, set in 1960s Baltimore, is about a middle-aged housewife turned aspiring journalist who pursues the murder of a forgotten young woman.

July 21, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join this virtual short story discussion about "Reunion" by John Cheever. The story is

about an eager young man who meets up with his divorced father while on a layover at New York's famed Grand Central Station.

July 27, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. -- Join this virtual book club to discuss "**The Nature of Fragile Things**" by **Susan Meissner**. Sophie Whalen is so desperate to get out of a New York City tenement that she answers an ad for a mail order bride and agrees to marry a man in San Diego who she's never met. Then one evening, a stranger at the door sets in motion a chain of events that intertwines the lives of three women on the eve of a devastating California earthquake and tests their resiliency, resolve, and their belief that love can overcome fear.

Other Helpful & Fun Library Offerings**

(Unless otherwise noted, all of these programs require registration. Instructions for registering can be found at the end of this section.)

(1) A Game of Bridge Anyone? -- Play Duplicate Bridge at the Monmouth County Library's Headquarters as part of an in-person group. (Please note, this is not a class to learn to play.) Seating is limited and on a first come, first seated basis. Duplicate Bridge is the most widely used variation of bridge in club play. It is called "duplicate" because the same bridge deal (for example, the arrangement of the 52 cards into the

four hands) is played at each table and scoring is based on relative performance. Duplicate Bridge players will meet:

- . July 6, 2022 from 12:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.
- . July 13, 2022 from 12:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.
- . July 20, 2022 from 12:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.
- . July 27, 2022 from 12:00 p.m. - 3:00 p.m.

(2) More Bridge Playing -- Play Bridge in person at the Monmouth County Library's Headquarters. This is a social interaction group, not a class to learn to play. Seating is limited and on a first-come, first seated basis. Bridge enthusiasts will meet:

- . July 11, 2022 from 6:00 p.m. - 8:30 p.m.
- . July 18, 2022 from 6:00 p.m. - 8:30 p.m.
- . July 25, 2022 from 6:00 p.m. - 8:30 p.m.

(3) Stop the Bleed(R) -- The number one cause of preventable death after an injury is bleeding. That's why the American College of Surgeons want you to learn how to Stop the Bleed(R). No prior experience is needed to take this course. **Anyone can learn how to help bleeding patients before medical professionals arrive.** The Stop the Bleed(R) program was launched in October of 2015 by the White House. Certification will be awarded upon successful completion of this hands-on course. Certified STB Instructor and EMT Connor Crafton-Tempel will present this hands-on, hour long course, which is free for registered participants at the Monmouth County Library Headquarters on the following dates and times:

(4) Stay Safe This Summer -- Join Rachel Tansey, MA Family & Community Health Sciences, Rutgers Cooperative Extension of Monmouth County, on July 12, 2022 for this virtual Zoom presentation on how to stay safe this summer whether you are spending time in the sun, grilling, or preparing food to serve outdoors.

(5) Travel Back In Time -- Through a wonderful in-person musical performance by "Just Friends" as they perform hits from the '50s, '60s, and '70's on July 13, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. at the Monmouth County Library Headquarters. No registration is required. Doors open at 6:00 p.m. Seating is on a first come basis (no saving seats permitted).

(6) Explore Your Inner Artist -- You can put your inner artist on display as you create a Monet-inspired tree during a live Zoom session with artist Barbara Freiberg on July 14, 2022 at 10:30 a.m. You will learn how to sketch and then fill in your drawing using Monet's style. To participate in this virtual art class you will need the following supplies: a regular pencil, eraser with rules/straightedge, one piece of white 9x12 sketch or drawing paper, and assorted colors of thin markers (Crayola Super Tips Washable Markers 50 pack or similar markers.), and a black ultra fine marker. (Please note: No personally identifiable information will be collected.). **The New Jersey Behavioral Risk Factor Survey, conducted in conjunction with the CDC, is seeking to understand the behavioral risk factors that affect residents' health both positively and negatively.** If you are called, your caller ID will indicate "New Jersey Department of Health". **State officials encourage all residents to participate in the survey if they are contacted.**
